
FREE TRAINING

In effect reduce the base of the 'accidental triangle'.

BECOME A CONSTRUCTION AMBASSADOR and help young people get excited about starting a career in construction. You can act as the face of the industry and inspire others.

What sort of people make Construction Ambassadors?

Construction Ambassadors come from many walks of life and you'll find them on-site and in the offices of many

projects all over the UK. You should be outgoing and enthusiastic about construction and be able to get this across to young people. You may be a young person yourself, but above all you'll need to be keen about being an ambassador and inspiring other young people. You could be a skilled Craftsman, a Technician, a Trainer, a member of Office staff, a Managing Director.

What about training? Where will I have to go? If it's just you attending, you will probably go to a one day regional course. If several from the same company wish to volunteer, then we'll try and arrange a course for you at your workplace if it's possible

Once you've finished this free training you'll be invited to a range of activities, probably a couple of times per year, usually in the Region you're based. Tell your staff about this, we believe that there'll be someone around who'd love to do this, given a chance. You'll be able to claim attendance grant for the training day too.

It's not just good for the individual, it can be of great benefit to your company - it can raise your profile, it enhances your company's social responsibilities, and you're engaging in education by reaching out to new entrants and helping them understand the industry **CONTACT US!**



Can you offer, or do you offer Work Experience Placements - Includes those in education and those not in education?

Discover how young people can bring an injection of enthusiasm and an eagerness to learn.

A work experience placement can last for up to six weeks (but is usually, a couple of weeks), giving the applicant time to pick up some skills and you the chance to see what they are made of - can they get up in the morning - can they get to the van or the office on time?

Employers who take part in this Experience Construction Programme (ECP) will receive:

- a good source of available candidates
- personal support from a CITB Apprenticeship Officer

Eligible employers will also receive a payment of up to £200 to support costs incurred for providing the work experience placement (i.e. for PPE etc.).

COSTS AND PAPERWORK

There is no cost to you, though some companies do give the applicant a small amount to cover travel costs but this is entirely optional. CITB staff will complete the majority of the paperwork, and on completion of the evaluation at the end of the placement **the £200 will be processed for payment automatically.**

The work experience candidate, although unpaid, will be covered by your organisation's Employer's Liability Insurance like any member of staff, and employers have the same responsibilities for their health, safety and welfare as they do for other employees, BUT, it's a myth that under 18's cannot visit or work on construction sites for work or work experience

WORKING HOURS AND SUPERVISION

The number of hours is normally agreed by the employer and candidate, but they should not work excessively long or unnecessarily unsocial hours.
